## THE MATCH-UP

Kansas City looks to rebound with a trip to Detroit to face the Lions on Sunday, Sept. 18. The Chiefs stand 0-1 in the regular season after an Opening Day 41-7 loss vs. Buffalo (9/13). Detroit won its first game of the season by a 27-20 count at Tampa Bay (9/13). Sunday's game features two head coaches hired in 2009 in Kansas City Head Coach Todd Haley and Detroit Head Coach Jim Schwartz.

The 2010 season marked a turning point for the Chiefs franchise as Kansas City turned in a 10-6 record after a 4-12 performance in 2009. It marked the best single-season turnaround in franchise history. The Chiefs won the AFC West Championship and earned a home playoff game for the first time since 2003.

Dating back to 2010 season, the Lions have won five consecutive regular season games. QB Matthew Stafford leads the Detroit offense after throwing for 305 yards and three touchdowns last week at Tampa Bay. RB Jahvid Best paced Detroit with 72 yards against the Buccaneers while WR Calvin Johnson had 88 receiving yards with two scores. On the defensive side of the ball, CB Chris Houston intercepted a Tampa Bay QB Josh Freeman pass.

Kansas City ranked in the NFL's top 10 in 10 different categories at the end of the 2010 season. The Chiefs won the league's rushing title, registering 2,627 rushing yards. On the road in 2010, the Chiefs gained a 1,164 rushing yards to rank fifth in the league.

The Chiefs finished 11th in the NFL a year ago, allowing 326 total points. Kansas City only allowed its opponents to score on 28.1% of their offensive drives, the seventh-lowest mark in the NFL. CB Brandon Flowers, LB Derrick Johnson and S Eric Berry each returned an interception for a touchdown.

QB Matt Cassel begins his third season at the helm of the offense after garnering a Pro Bowl invite a year ago. RB Jamaal Charles finished second in the NFL in 2010 with 1,467 rushing yards to earn his first Pro Bowl invite. WR Dwayne Bowe caught a league-high 15 TDs and was elected to his initial Pro Bowl. On defense, Johnson paced the club with a career-high 147 tackles.

Kansas City has a trip to San Diego for a contest with the Chargers on Sunday, Sept. 25 at 3:05 p.m. (CT). Up next for Detroit is a game at Minnesota on Sunday, Sept. 25 at Noon (CT).

## THE SERIES

Kansas City is 7-4 (.636) all-time in regular season action against Detroit. The Chiefs have posted a 5-1 (.833) mark in contests at Arrowhead Stadium. The Lions lead the series in games at Detroit by a 3-2 mark (.600). The two clubs have played in three different facilities in Detroit, including Tiger Stadium, the Pontiac Silverdome and Ford Field. Detroit and Kansas City have matched up 10 times in preseason action with the Lions leading the series by a 6-4 (.600) mark.

Detroit won the last game between the two clubs by a 25-20 count at Ford Field (12/23/07). The Chiefs spent seven hours on the runway at the Kansas City airport waiting out a snowstorm before departing for Detroit. QB Damon Huard threw for 305 yards and two touchdowns in the game. Detroit has hosted Kansas City for a pair of Thanksgiving Day games, as the Lions have won both of those contests.

Kansas City has won the last three games at Arrowhead Stadium. The Chiefs clinched the 2003 AFC West with a 45-17 win vs. Detroit (12/14/03) in the Lions last game at Arrowhead Stadium. QB Trent Green became the first QB in Chiefs history to post a perfect 158.3 passer rating. The Chiefs three-game home winning streak against the Lions started with a 43-24 victory (10/14/90), a game in which RB Barry Word rushed for 200 yards.

## CHIEFS HEAD COACH - TODD HALEY



Todd Haley was named the 11th head coach of the Kansas City Chiefs on Feb. 6, 2009 and is in his third year leading the Chiefs. Haley is in his 17th season in the NFL in 2011 and his 15th season as an NFL coach after beginning his career as a scouting assistant with the N.Y. Jets in '95.

Haley led the Chiefs to a 10-6 record in 2010 after posting a 4-12 mark in 2009 for the best single-season turnaround in franchise history. Kansas City won the AFC West Championship as Haley was named the NFL Coach of the Year by the NFL Alumni Association and the AFC Coach of the Year by the Committee of 101.

Haley joined the Chiefs after a two-year stint as Arizona's offensive coordinator (2007-08), helping the Cardinals reach Super Bowl XLIII as the club won its first division title since '75. He has made playoff appearances with five different NFL teams. He served as passing game coordinator/WRs coach under Bill Parcells with Dallas (2004-06) after beginning his career under Parcells with the N.Y. Jets ('97-00). He also served as WRs coach with Chicago (2001-03). Born on Feb. 28, 1967, Haley grew up in Upper St. Clair, Pa. He is the son of long-time NFL personnel executive Dick Haley, who helped build the Steelers Super Bowl teams of the '70s. He was a '91 graduate of the University of North Florida.

## FIRST DOWNS

Kansas City permitted only 18.3 first downs per game in 2010, a figure that ranked 14th in the NFL. The Chiefs allowed 88 first downs via the run to tie for 11th in the league. On the offensive side of the ball, Kansas City converted 19.9 first downs per game to rank 11th in the NFL. The team posted 129 rushing first downs, trailing only Jacksonville (148). Detroit allowed 20.0 total first downs per game a year ago, an average that ranked 24th in the NFL. The Lions tied for third in the NFL by allowing 35 first downs via penalty. That total trailed only Oakland (44) and Arizona (38). Detroit permitted only 17 first downs at Tampa Bay (9/11), including just one rushing first down.

## LIONS HEAD COACH - JIM SCHWARTZ



Jim Schwartz was named the 25th head coach in Lions history on Jan. 16, 2009. He has spent 18 seasons in the NFL, including 15 years as a coach and three campaigns working in player personnel. He has posted a 9-24 record (.273) with Detroit since his arrival.

Schwartz spent 10 seasons as an assistant with the Tennessee Titans ('99-08). He spent his final eight campaigns with Tennessee (2001-08) as the defensive coordinator. During his final two seasons with Tennessee, the Titans had a 23-9 regular season record. Schwartz also served as the linebackers coach/third-down package (2000) and defensive assistant ('99) with the Titans.

The Baltimore, Md. native served as a defensive assistant with Baltimore ('96-98) in his first coaching position in the NFL. Schwartz entered the NFL as a college/pro scout with Cleveland ('93-95), serving on the same staff as current Chiefs General Manager Scott Pioli.

Schwartz enjoyed coaching stops at Colgate ('92), North Carolina Central ('91), Minnesota ('90) and Maryland ('89) on the collegiate level. He was a four-year letterwinner as a linebacker at Georgetown University, earning Division III All-America honors in '89.

## WORST-TO-FIRST FINISHES SINCE 2003

- Todd Haley joined Chiefs Hall of Fame inductee Marty Schottenheimer (11-5 in '90) as the only other coach to guide the Chiefs to a double-digit victory tally in his second season with KC.
- Haley, Schottenheimer ('90) and Herm Edwards (2006) are the only three coaches in franchise history to lead the Chiefs to the postseason in their first or second year at the helm of the Chiefs.
- Haley became just the second coach in franchise annals to record a worst-to-first turnaround. Dick Vermeil accomplished the feat in 2002-03.
- It marked the eighth-consecutive season a team has won its division crown after finishing last the previous season.

## 2011 KANSAS CITY CHIEFS

Kansas City won the AFC West with a 10-6 mark in 2010, including a 7-1 record at Arrowhead Stadium. Head Coach Todd Haley is in his third season as the head coach of the Chiefs. QB Matt Cassel is in his third campaign leading the Chiefs offense after earning his first Pro Bowl invitation a year ago. RB Jamaal Charles has topped the 1,000-yard-rushing plateau the last two seasons, ranking second in the NFL with 1,467 yards in 2010. RB Thomas Jones added 896 yards on the ground as the club led the NFL in rushing (2,627). FB LeRon McClain joined the club as an unrestricted free agent from Baltimore. WR Dwayne Bowe led the league with 15 TD receptions in 2010, the highest seasonal total in club history. WR Jerheme Urban missed the 2010 campaign on IR while WR Steve Breaston joins the WR corps in 2011. They are joined by WRs Jonathan Baldwin, Keary Colbert, Terrance Copper and Dexter McCluster. C Casey Wiegmann has played in 160 straight games and lined up for 10,197 consecutive snaps.

LB Tamba Hali had a sack vs. Buffalo (9/11) after finishing second in the NFL with a career-high 14.5 sacks in 2010. LB Derrick Johnson led the club with a career-best 147 tackles and returned an INT for a TD in 2010. LB Jovan Belcher had 97 tackles a year ago. DE Glenn Dorsey and DE Tyson Jackson man the end positions while DL Kelly Gregg handles the nose tackle position in the club's 3-4 defensive alignment. DE Wallace Gilberry was second on the team with 7.0 QB takedowns. DL Allen Bailey and Jerrell Powe joined the club as draft picks. CBs Brandon Flowers and Brandon Carr return for their fourth seasons. Flowers had an INT vs. Buffalo (9/13). S Kendrick Lewis opened at the other safety spot in 2010. Jon McGraw, Sabby Piscitelli and Donald Washington all work at safety.

P Dustin Colquitt handles the punting duties for the seventh-consecutive season, ranking first in club history in gross average (44.09), net average (38.65) and punts inside the 20 (178). K Ryan Succop has converted 80.4% of his field goals in three seasons. LS Thomas Gafford is the long snapper.

## 2011 DETROIT LIONS

Head Coach Jim Schwartz is in his third season leading the Detroit Lions and has guided Detroit to five straight victories dating back to last season. The Lions defeated the Tampa Bay Buccaneers by a 27-20 score in Week 1. QB Matthew Stafford completed 24 of 33 passes (72.7%) for 305 yards (12.7 avg.) and three TDs last week, including two to WR Calvin Johnson. Injuries limited Stafford to three games in 2010, when he completed 57 of 96 passes (59.4%) for 535 yards and six TDs. Johnson had six receptions for 88 yards last week. He tied for second in the NFL with 12 TD catches and ranked ninth with 1,120 yards on 77 catches (14.5 avg.) in 2010. TE Brandon Pettigrew added four catches for 57 yards last week and is coming off a 71-catch season for 722 yards (10.2 avg.) with four TDs last year. WR Nate Burleson contributed 55 receptions for 625 yards (11.4 avg.) and six TDs a year ago. RB Jahvid Best rushed for 72 yards on 21 carries (3.4 avg.) against the Bucs and led the team with 555 rushing yards on 171 carries (3.2 avg.) in 2010.

The Detroit defense is led by last year's AP Defensive Rookie of the Year, DT Ndamukong Suh, who was a Pro Bowl starter after finishing with 66 tackles (49 solo) and 10.0 sacks. He also recorded an INT, FF and FR in 2010. S Louis Delmas led the team with 84 tackles (64 solo) and had 2.0 sacks, two FRs and two FFs. DE Cliff Avril registered 8.5 sacks, a FF and FR a year ago. CB Alphonso Smith led Detroit with five INTs.

K Jason Hanson returns for his 20th season and converted 12 of 14 field goals (85.7%) and all 19 PATs for 55 points last year before suffering a season-ending injury. Rookie Ryan Donahue handles the punting duties and averaged 48.2 yards per boot last week at Tampa Bay with a long of 60 yards. WR Stefan Logan handles all return duties and was named a Pro Bowl alternate last year. He finished fifth in the NFL in kickoff return average (26.8) and punt return average (12.1). He was second in the NFL with 1,810 kickoff return yards, including a 105-yard return for a TD.

## CONTROLLING THE GROUND GAME

Dating back to 2010, Kansas City has produced a league-high 160.9 rushing yards per game. During that time period, the Chiefs have totaled 2,735 rushing yards and 13 TDs on 574 carries. Kansas City is 10-2 when outrushing its opponents since 2010, but has lost five-consecutive games when being outgained on the ground. A year ago, the Chiefs ranked second in the NFL with 72 runs of 10+ yards. Only Philadelphia (73) had more. RB Jamaal Charles led the NFL with 45 carries of 10+ yards.

Kansas City's ground game produced 2,627 rushing yards a year ago, ranking first in the NFL. The team's 164.2 rushing yards per game in 2010 was the fourth-best seasonal mark in Chiefs annals. It marked the first time the Chiefs had led the NFL in rushing since averaging 138.9 rushing yards per game in '95.

Under Head Coach Jim Schwartz, the Lions have allowed 123.6 rushing yards per game dating back to 2009. Detroit ranks 23rd in the NFL during that time period. A year ago, the Lions finished 24th in the league by allowing 125.8 rushing ypg. Detroit held Tampa Bay to only 56 rushing yards last week (9/11), including just 14 in the first half. In the friendly confines of Ford Field, Detroit permitted 105.4 rushing ypg, a mark that was 13th in the NFL in 2010.

The Kansas City defense improved in the run game in 2010 compared to 2009. The club ranked 14th in the NFL, allowing 110.3 rushing yards per game, a decrease of 46.2 yards from 2009. Opponents only scored 11 rushing touchdowns vs. the Chiefs in 2010.

Detroit finished the 2010 campaign producing 100.8 rushing ypg to finish 23rd in the NFL. The Lions joined Indianapolis and Seattle as the only three teams in the league to not have a running back produce 600 rushing yards or more in 2010. RB Jahvid Best led Detroit with 555 yards.

## 100-YARD RUSHERS

Kansas City produced a 100-yard rusher in six games in 2010, posting a 5-1 record in those contests. RB Thomas Jones had a pair of 100-yard rushing games in 2010 with the Chiefs going 1-1 in those contests. The 12-year veteran has 34 career 100-yard rushing games with his teams posting a 20-14 record in those games. RB Jamaal Charles topped the 100-yard plateau in four games a year ago as the Chiefs went 4-0 in those contests. Charles twice recorded 170 or more rushing yards, including a season-high 177 rushing yards vs. Buffalo (10/31/10). Detroit won its lone contest when producing a 100-yard rusher in 2010. RB Maurice Morris had 109 rushing yards at Tampa Bay (12/19/10). Dating back to 2009, the Lions have produced a 100+ yard rusher in three contests, trying Dallas for the fewest in the NFL. Detroit has registered a 2-1 record in those contests.

## PROTECTING THE PASSER

The Kansas City offensive line allowed only 32.0 sacks in 2010, a figure that tied for 12th in the NFL. In its 10 wins a year ago, the protectors allowed 12.0 QB takedowns. QB Matt Cassel was only sacked 26.0 times in 2010. In the club's first game vs. Buffalo (9/13), the Chiefs permitted 2.0 QB takedowns.

Detroit's defense produced 44.0 sacks in 2010, a total that ranked sixth in the NFL. Pittsburgh led the league with 48.0 QB takedowns. Dating back to 2009, the Lions have produced 70.0 sacks and have recorded a sack in 20 consecutive contests. DT Ndamukong Suh led all rookies in the NFL with 10.0 sacks a year ago.

The Chiefs defense recorded 39.0 sacks a year ago, 17.0 more than in 2009. In the club's 10 wins in 2010, the Chiefs produced 26.0 sacks. That total tied for the seventh most sacks in wins in the NFL. Meanwhile, Detroit allowed 27.0 sacks a year ago, tying for the sixth fewest in the NFL.

## CLOSE GAMES

The final margin of an NFL game often comes down to the fourth quarter as the winning tally is separated by seven points or less. Kansas City was 4-2 in games that were decided by seven points or less a year ago. In the 256 games in the NFL a year ago, 121 of those were separated by seven points or less (47.3%). The Chiefs were 2-1 in games that were decided by three points or less.

Detroit was 4-6 in games decided by seven points or less. During its five-game regular season winning streak, the club has won by an average margin of 5.60 ppg as all those games have been decided by seven points or less.

## TURNOVER MARGIN

Kansas City finished 2010 tied for fifth in the NFL with a +9 turnover differential (23 takes/14 gives). The four teams with a better turnover differential were all 2010 playoff qualifiers, including the top two seeds in the AFC playoffs (New England, Pittsburgh). Kansas City's +9 mark was an eight-turnover improvement over the club's 2009 mark of +1. The Chiefs were 5-2 with a positive turnover margin in 2010, including a 2-2 record on the road.

The Chiefs finished sixth in the NFL in turnover point differential with a mark of +48 points a year ago. Kansas City scored 75 points off of takeaways while allowing only 27 points off giveaways. New England (24) was the only team to allow fewer points off giveaways than Kansas City. The top six teams in turnover point differential were all playoff qualifiers in 2010.

Detroit posted a +4 turnover differential (29 takes/25 gives) in 2010 to tie for 11th in the NFL. The Lions recovered 15 fumbles a year ago, ranking fourth in the NFL. Dating back to 2009, Detroit is 2-12 (.143) when posting a negative turnover margin, including a 2-5 (.286) mark at home. Meanwhile the club is 5-6 (.455) overall when positive. The Lions allowed its opponents to score 80 points off their giveaways while converting their 29 takeaways into 93 points in 2010. Detroit forced two turnovers at Tampa Bay (9/13) and finished the game with a +1 turnover margin (2 takes/1 give).

The Chiefs have posted 5-3 record (.625) against opponents from the NFC dating back to 2009. The club has won five-consecutive contests against NFC teams, outscoring those opponents by a 15.8 margin (145-66) in those teams. In its last three games in an NFC stadium, the Chiefs have come out with the victory in all three games.

Dating back to 2009, Detroit is just 2-6 (.250) against AFC opponents. In those eight contests, Lions have been outscored by 10.1 ppg (164-245). Detroit had lost five-straight games against AFC opponents before posting a 34-27 victory at Miami (12/26/10). Detroit has dropped its last two interconference home games.

## POINTS ON THE BOARD

Kansas City scored 22.9 points per game in 2010 to rank 14th in the NFL. The club tallied 137 points in the second quarter of games, the fifth-highest total in the league. In its eight home games a year ago, Kansas City scored 24.0 ppg. That total tied for 11th in the NFL. The Chiefs outscored their opponents at Arrowhead by a 192-118 point margin (9.3 ppg) in 2010. In the club's 10 wins a year ago, the Chiefs outscored their opponents 267-138, a 129-point margin (12.9 ppg).

Despite posting a 6-10 record in 2010, the Lions were only outscored by seven total points. Detroit scored 22.7 points per game while allowing 23.1 ppg in 2010. The Lions lost their 10 games by an average of 7.80 ppg, the seventh-lowest average margin of defeat in the NFL.

## KANSAS CITY'S WINNING WAYS

The Chiefs won their sixth AFC West title in 2010 after previously winning the division in '71, '93, '95, '97 and 2003. The 2010 division championship was the ninth in franchise history, including AFL West crowns in '62, '66 and '68. Kansas City shared the '68 title with Oakland. The Chiefs finished 10-6 for the fifth time in team history, qualifying for the playoffs for the 16th time in franchise annals. The Chiefs made a six-game leap in the win column from 2009 (4-12) to 2010 (10-6), the biggest leap in team history. The club enjoyed five-game jumps on two previous occasions: 2002 (8-8) to 2003 (13-3) and '61 (6-8) to '62 (11-3).

A day after sitting on a charter flight for nearly seven hours waiting out a snowstorm, the Chiefs began the game slowly. After watching the Lions build a 19-0 lead, Kansas City rallied to get within two points at 22-20 before eventually falling 25-20 at Ford Field in Detroit.

The Lions would score in all three phases of the game in the early going. First, an eight-play, 80-yard scoring drive concluded with an 11-yard scoring run from RB T.J. Duckett. Then, P Dustin Colquitt had a punt blocked for the first time in his career as Lions TE Casey FitzSimmons broke through the middle of the line to bat down the kick. The ball would spin out of the end zone for a safety as the Lions took a 9-0 lead.

Detroit K Jason Hanson knocked in a 46-yard field goal on the ensuing possession to push the Lions ahead 12-0. Before the scoring binge was over Detroit LB Paris Lenon intercepted a QB Brodie Croyle pass and returned it 61 yards for a touchdown to give the Lions a 19-0 lead midway through the second stanza. To make matters worse, Croyle injured his hand on the play while trying to make a touchdown-saving tackle.

With KC's starting QB unable to return, QB Damon Huard stepped under center. Despite losing LT Damion McIntosh and RB Kolby Smith to injuries on the drive, Huard and company orchestrated a 12-play, 80-yard touchdown drive. Newly-acquired RB Jackie Battle took over the running back duties and followed the lead of reserve T Herb Taylor to score a three-yard TD on his first NFL carry.

Kansas City S Bernard Pollard gave the ball right back to the offense when he intercepted a QB Jon Kitna pass. The Chiefs converted the turnover into points as Huard perfectly executed the two-minute offense. Four straight completions including a 21-yard strike to TE Tony Gonzalez pushed the ball deep into Lions territory. After WR Dwayne Bowe converted a third-and-four with a catch down to the one-yard line, Huard floated a TD pass to DE Jared Allen. Allen's second TD of the season helped Kansas City cut a 19-0 deficit to 19-14 at the half.

Detroit tacked on a 20-yard Hanson field goal in the third quarter before the Chiefs went on the attack again. Following an impressive 10-play, 70-yard drive, the Chiefs scored their first fourth-quarter points since posting 15 such points vs. Green Bay (11/4). Huard completed seven-of-seven passes including a 34-yard touchdown pass on fourth down in which Bowe outleapt a Detroit defender in the end zone. The Chiefs would attempt a two-point conversion in an effort to tie the game, but Huard's pass was knocked down at the line of scrimmage leaving the score 22-20. A late Detroit field goal gave the Chiefs too little time to comeback as their final possession ended at the Detroit 30-yard line.

Led by four QB Ryan Fitzpatrick touchdown passes, the Buffalo Bills defeated the Kansas City Chiefs 41-7 in the 2011 season opener in front of 68,755 fans at Arrowhead Stadium. Buffalo outgained the Chiefs 364-to-213 in total net yardage and possessed the ball for 37:02, compared to 22:58 for the Chiefs.

The game, which fell on the 10th anniversary of the Sept. 11, 2001 attacks on America, opened with a touching pregame ceremony that included a field-size American flag, a live rendition of 'Taps' played from the Shanksville, Pa. crash site, a flyover of A-10s from Whiteman Air Force Base and hundreds of Kansas City firefighters and police officers.

Following the ceremony, Buffalo wasted no time getting off to a quick start, capitalizing on a RB Dexter McCluster fumble on the opening kickoff. Buffalo took an early 7-0 lead when Fitzpatrick found TE Scott Chandler on a four-yard scoring pass with 12:14 left in the first quarter. The Bills drove 26 yards on five plays in 2:39.

The Bills increased their lead to 14-0 with 0:55 left in the first quarter when Fitzpatrick led a six-play, 75-yard drive in 3:37, capped off by a 27-yard touchdown pass to WR Stevie Johnson. TE Shawn Nelson added a key 35-yard reception on the play prior to the score. Fitzpatrick was three-for-three passing for 71 yards on the drive.

Buffalo outgained Kansas City 117-to-42 in total net yards during the first quarter, including an 80-to-nine net passing advantage.

On the first drive of the second quarter, the Chiefs appeared to have cut the lead in half when Cassel found TE Leonard Pope on a 19-yard pass in the end zone, but the score was overturned after a replay review. A missed field goal later on the drive left the score at 14-0.

K Rian Lindell increased the lead to 17-0 with a 29-yard field goal with 6:42 left in the second quarter. The Buffalo scoring drive covered nine plays and 50 yards in 5:04.

Following a Chiefs fumble, Lindell added a second field goal when he connected from 38 yards out with 5:38 remaining in the first half to give the Bills a 20-0 advantage.

The Chiefs got in the scoring column when Cassel threw a six-yard TD pass to Charles with 1:46 left in the half. On the drive, the Chiefs went 81 yards on 11 plays in 3:52. RB Dexter McCluster contributed a 23-yard run and WR Steve Breaston's first reception as a Chief went for 20 yards to set up the score.

With 4:19 left in the third quarter, Fitzpatrick hooked up with Chandler for a second touchdown from 11 yards out, giving the Bills a 27-7 advantage. On the drive, Buffalo ran eight plays covering 59 yards in 5:52.

Fitzpatrick threw his fourth TD pass to WR Donald Jones with 0:14 remaining in the third quarter, connecting on a four-yard strike. The drive covered 32 yards on six plays in 2:50.

Bills RB C.J. Spiller scored on a nine-yard run with 11:50 left in the game to cap a four-play, 28-yard drive in 2:11, making the score 41-7.

Fitzpatrick finished 17-for-25 passing for 208 yards on the afternoon. RB Fred Jackson carried the ball 20 times for 112 yards while Chandler caught a team-high five passes. Johnson and Nelson both tied for a game-high 66 receiving yards.

Cassel completed 22 of 36 passes for 119 yards on the afternoon. Charles gained 56 yards on 10 carries and tied with McCluster for a team-best five receptions.
