**SUMMARY**

The Lions opened the 2009 season against the high powered Saints offense in New Orleans. The Saints started the scoring early, taking the opening kickoff to their own 46-yard line and scoring on a 9-yard pass from QB Drew Brees to WR Marques Colston. After a Lions three-and-out, the Saints' punt return resulted in another short field, and Brees capped that drive with a 39-yard strike to WR Robert Meachem. QB Matthew Stafford then returned to the field and put together his first scoring drive. On first down, he completed a 21-yard pass to WR Calvin Johnson, but later the Lions failed to convert on third down in Saints' territory. K Jason Hanson was on hand to convert the field goal, making the score 14-3. Later in the first quarter, the Saints punted to Lions WR/PR Dennis Northcutt, who split two tacklers and went 43 yards to the Saints' 18-yard line. The Lions then decided to go for the touchdown on 4th-and-1 at the Saints' 4-yard line, and RB Kevin Smith ran it in to cut the Lions' deficit to four points. The Saints again looked poised to score, but Brees' pass was intercepted by CB Anthony Henry in the end zone and returned 26 yards. The Lions gave the ball back soon after, and the Saints drove 65 yards to score on a pass from Brees to TE Jeremy Shockey. With a chance to counter, the Lions punted and the Saints scored again with the same passing combination, making the score 28-10. After the Lions recovered a muffed punt, Stafford was intercepted at the goal-line by Saints' S Darren Sharper, setting up another possible scoring drive for the Saints, which ended with a blocked field goal by DE Dewayne White, sending the teams into halftime at 28-10. Coming out of the break, Stafford completed a short pass to C. Johnson which stretched into a 64-yard gain. Stafford later kept the ball and scored to make the score 28-17. The Saints responded with a field goal after a long drive, 31-17. On the ensuing kickoff, rookie RB/KR Aaron Brown broke through the Saints' coverage for an 87-yard return, but the Lions settled for a field goal to put the deficit back at 11 points. It was short-lived as the Saints returned Hanson's kickoff to their own 42-yard line and scored on a pass from Brees to WR Devery Henderson on their first play from scrimmage. Stafford was then intercepted by Saints' LB Scott Shanle, but on their next play, RB Mike Bell's fumble ball was scooped up by S Louis Delmas and returned 65 yards for a touchdown to make the score 38-27 going into the fourth quarter. The Saints' next possession again ended in a touchdown, this time from Brees to FB Heath Evans, 45-27. The Lions again attempted a comeback, entering Saints' territory. However, Stafford was intercepted a second time by Sharper, allowing the Saints to run out the rest of the clock and come away with a 45-27 victory.

**SUMMARY**

In their 2009 home opener, the Lions took on NFC North rivals the Minnesota Vikings. The Vikings won the toss and elected to receive, sending the Lions' defense onto the field early to face the run-based attack of the Vikings. The Vikings quickly picked up a first down in the Lions' territory, but a bad exchange caused RB Adrian Peterson to fumble the ball, and it was recovered by LB Ernie Sims. The Lions then used a balanced attack to move 40 yards to the Vikings' 12-yard line, but were forced to take the field goal by K Jason Hanson when they failed to convert, making the score 3-0. After the score, the Lions defense came out strong once again, stifling the trickery of the Vikings on first down and then putting the Vikings in a hole when DE Jason Hunter came up with a sack on QB Brett Favre. On the Lions' next possession, the offense moved the ball well once again into Vikings' territory, but QB Matthew Stafford was intercepted by LB Chad Greenway at the 31-yard line. Despite the turnover, the Vikings were unable to get anything going against the Lions' defense. Led by LB Larry Foote, who had a tackle for a loss and a sack, the Lions forced two three-and-outs to get the ball back. Starting at their own 25-yard line, the Lions used a solid running attack to reach the red zone and the drive was capped off by Stafford's first career touchdown pass—an 8-yard toss to WR Calvin Johnson. Protecting a 10 point lead, the Lions defense took the field once again to try to put the clamps on Minnesota's offense, but the Vikings responded quickly, scoring on a 1-yard pass from Favre to TE Visanthe Shiancoe with just over a minute remaining in the half. The Lions then let the clock run out, heading into the locker room with a 10-7 lead. After halftime, the Lions received and set out to continue their success on offense. Vikings DE Jared Allen sacked Stafford on first down, forcing a fumble that was recovered by TE Brandon Pettigrew. Stafford was sacked again on third down, which ended in a punting situation. The Vikings then tied the game on a 26-yard field goal by K Ryan Longwell. With the game tied and the ball on the Lions' 31-yard line, RB Kevin Smith fumbled and it was recovered by Greenway. On the Vikings' first play from scrimmage, Peterson appeared to be stopped at the line, but bounced outside and outran the defenders for a 27-yard touchdown to make the score 17-10. Later on in the 4th quarter, the Vikings were once again in Lions' territory and extended their lead with a 46-yard field goal by Longwell. Now trailing by 10 points, Stafford looked to close the gap but was intercepted a second time by Greenway, and the Vikings' linebacker returned the ball to the Lions' 16-yard line. Favre connected on a screen pass to WR Percy Harvin, who eluded defenders to score and make the Vikings lead 27-10. Forced into a passing situation, Stafford led the lions to the Vikings' 30-yard line, but the offense could only come up with a field goal. The ensuing onside kick was recovered by the Vikings, allowing them to keep the ball until the game ended, winning 27-13.

**SUMMARY**

The Lions entered this contest against the Washington Redskins having won only five times of their last 35 meetings. After receiving the opening kickoff, Detroit was unable to get a drive going and had to punt. Washington moved the ball steadily down the field through the air down to the Detroit 9-yard line and looked to come up with the game's first points, but LBs Larry Foote and DeAndre Levy had two big stops on third and fourth down at the goal line to keep the game scoreless. On the ensuing possession, QB Matthew Stafford engineered a 12 play, 99-yard drive, hitting WR Bryant Johnson from 21-yards out for the touchdown. It was Johnson's first TD catch as a Lion and the offense's longest drive of the season. The Detroit defense forced a quick punt out of the Redskins offense, and the Lions started at their own six-yard line after a nice punt from P Hunter Smith. Once again, the offense was not hindered by the field position. The running game, led by RB Kevin Smith, helped move the offense, but the drive would stall, and the Lions came away with a 39-yard field goal by K Jason Hanson to put the home team up 10-0. The Detroit defense forced a three-and-out, and the Lions took over inside its own 10-yard line for the third time. With a mixture of run and pass, the offense moved down to the Washington 8-yard line, but the Redskins defense held Detroit to another field goal to end the half at 13-0. Washington received to start the second half and needed only four plays to score when QB Jason Campbell connected with WR Santana Moss, who raced down the Detroit sideline 57 yards to make the score 13-7. Both defenses put the clamps until the fourth quarter, when Stafford led the offense on another long scoring drive. This time the Lions went 85 yards in eight plays and handed off to RB Maurice Morris, who took it two yards for the touchdown. After a failed two-point conversion the Lions went up 19-7. Campbell and the Redskins answered back with its own eight play touchdown drive, ending with a four-yard pass from Campbell to RB Rock Cartwright. With 2:36 remaining, Stafford had to eat clock to secure a win. He did his part by completing a gutsy 24-yard pass to TE Will Heller for a first down. However, the Redskins still had three timeouts and the two-minute warning to stop the clock, and eventually the Lions punted to the Washington 22-yard line. After a couple of Campbell passes to TE Chris Cooley, RB Ladell Betts, and Moss, the Redskins entered Lions' territory but were out of timeouts and spiked at the Lions 36-yard line. On the final play of the game, Campbell hit Moss over the middle for a hook-and-ladder, but the game—and the Lions' 19-game losing streak—ended when Foote made the final tackle on Betts.

With the ball back in their hands, the Lions' offense continued to be efficient, scoring again on a pass from Stafford to TE Will Heller. Ahead 14-7, the Lions' defense forced a three-and-out, but the offense stalled when Stafford was sacked, forcing a punt that was returned deep into Lions' territory by WR Devin Hester. The Bears scored quickly on a pass from Cutler to TE Kellen Davis. After receiving the kickoff, the Lions found themselves in a third-and-long situation. Stafford felt the pressure from the Bear's pass rush and was intercepted by DT Tommie Harris to give the Bears another short field. This time, Cutler completed a short pass to TE Greg Olsen to put the Bears ahead 21-14. The teams exchanged punts and the Lions took control of the ball at their own 2-yard line with 4:51 remaining in the first half. Stafford led the offense 98 yards, ending on Smith's second touchdown run of the day to leave the teams deadlocked at 21 going into halftime. Out of the break, the Bears immediately grabbed control of the game on a 102-yard kickoff return by WR Johnny Knox. A big sack by the Bears' defense put the Lions in another third-and-long deep in their own territory, and they then gave up another big punt return, setting up a field goal by K Robbie Gould to make the score 31-21. The Bears continued to win the field position battle with the Lions, taking another field goal in the third quarter after a fumble by Stafford and constantly forcing the Lions to punt from inside their own territory. **SUMMARY**

With the reigning champion Steelers in town, the Lions looked to establish themselves against one of the NFL's best teams. The defense forced a three-and-out from the Steelers on their first possession. With the ball on their own 22-yard line, QB Daunte Culpepper, in his first start of 2009, took over. The offense appeared shaky when Culpepper was sacked by LB James Harrison and fumbled on first down, but the ball was recovered and he went on to scramble for 32 yards on third down. The drive ended on a 46-yard field goal by K Jason Hanson. The Steelers then retook the field and scored behind the passing of QB Ben Roethlisberger and the touchdown run of RB Rashard Mendenhall. On the Lions' next possession, Culpepper led the team inside the Steelers' 10-yard line, but an intentional grounding penalty backed them up to create second and goal from the 23-yard line. The Lions would have to settle for another field goal to make the score 7-6. The Steelers again began driving, and Roethlisberger was intercepted by CB Eric King. However, the interception was negated by a controversial roughing the passer penalty and the Steelers scored on a pass from Roethlisberger to TE Heath Miller. A Lions three-and-out gave the ball back to the Steelers very quickly. WR Mike Wallace dropped a wide open pass and Roethlisberger looked to connect with him again, but this time CB William James jumped the route and took the interception 38 yards for the score. Roethlisberger shook off the interception, leading the Steelers into Lions' territory then hitting WR Hines Ward for a 17-yard touchdown to put ahead 21-13 at halftime. Coming out of the break, the Lions hoped to break their trend of slow starts in the second half. It seemed they would by scoring on their first possession, but Hanson missed a 49-yard field goal. Culpepper moved the ball well and found WR Dennis Northcutt over the middle for a 25-yard touchdown that closed the gap to eight points. The Lions defense shut down the Steelers on the ensuing possession to give Detroit the ball 3:07 remaining along with two timeouts. The Lions moved all the way to the Steelers' 21-yard line, but the Steelers' sense of urgency kicked in and their pressure sacked Culpepper on three straight plays. **SUMMARY**

The Lions traveled to Lambeau Field to take on the Packers and try to end a dry spell in Green Bay dating back to 1991. On the opening kickoff, a Packers touchdown was nullified by an offensive holding penalty, and rather than taking the 6 points, they started on their own 20-yard line. WR Greg Jennings made a one-handed grab on third down to extend the drive, and later QB Aaron Rodgers connected on a 47-yard touchdown to WR James Jones. The Lions first possession began with two plays for a loss of yardage, then on third down QB Daunte Culpepper's screen pass was intercepted by DE Cullen Jenkins. With a short field in front of them, the Packers scored again quickly on a pass from Rodgers to FB John Kuhn to make the score 14-0. The Lions then registered another three-and-out to give the ball back to the Packers, who succumbed to the Lions' pressure and were stopped in their own territory. After connecting with WR Dennis Northcutt and a 9-yard run by RB Kevin Smith, the Lions entered the Packers' end of the field but were put in a fourth-and-one situation. The Lions chose to go for the first down instead of taking the points, but were stopped and the Packers took control of the ball. The Lions' defense stopped the Packers once again, but the offense failed to get anything going and continued to have to punt away to Green Bay. One their next try, the Packers came away with a 46-yard field goal by K Mason Crosby. The drive ended with another punt, and Green Bay drove 70 yards but again were only able to come up with a field goal, which would be the final score of the game. Stanton was intercepted on the next drive, which led to the Packers retaking possession and moving down to the Lions' 3-yard line. Peterson prevented a score by sacking Rodgers and forcing a fumble, which was recovered by LB Larry Foote. The Lions punted once again, and with the Packers continuing to move the ball, Rodgers was intercepted by LB DeAndre Levy, his first career interception. Stanton led the Lions inside the Packers' 10-yard line, but another interception ended the Lions last chance to score, and sent them into their bye week with a shutout loss.

**SUMMARY**

After a bye week that was used to review the first part of the season and allow players to heal, the Lions got set to host the winless St. Louis Rams at Ford Field. This game marked the return of rookie QB Matthew Stafford, who missed two games due to an injured knee. The other big news on the injury front was WR Calvin Johnson, who missed his second straight game since injuring his knee against Pittsburgh (10/11). The Lions received the opening kickoff and looked to establish the run game immediately with four straight carries by RB Kevin Smith. The drive appeared to be moving before a holding penalty and later a dropped pass on third down led to a punting situation. When the Rams got the ball, they too looked to establish the run with RB Steven Jackson. On a critical third down, LB Julian Peterson was flagged for roughing the passer which extended the Rams' drive, ending in a field goal by K Josh Brown. The Lions sought to respond quickly and put together their longest drive of the day. Beginning at their own 20-yard line, Stafford led the team 68 yards to the Rams' 12-yard line. On third-and-ten, Stafford's receiver dropped yet another pass and it was intercepted by S James Butler in the end zone. Butler attempted to return the interception and left the end zone, but was later ran back into the end zone on his own and was tackled by Smith for a safety to make the score 3-2. Dropped passes continued to plague the Lions' offense and they were unable to get into scoring range, giving the ball back to the Rams. Near the end of the half, the Rams drove into Lions' territory and were faced with a fourth down. They set up to try to convert the fourth down, but then called a timeout and came out of it with their field goal personnel in place. The Lions were fooled by a fake on what would have been a 53-yard field goal attempt, and Brown passed to a wide open TE Daniel Fells, who staved off a tackle to score. The teams entered the locker room at halftime with the score at 10-2. Late in the third quarter, the Rams found themselves deep in the Lions' end of the field once again. As QB Marc Bulger threw, the ball was tipped in the air and then intercepted by DE Dewayne White, who was tackled at the spot. Re-energized by the turnover, the Lions drove and connected on a 36-yard pass from Stafford to WR Bryant Johnson to put themselves inside the Rams' 5-yard line. After a 1-yard gain, Stafford dropped back to pass and scrambled to the end zone for the touchdown. The Lions attempted the two-point conversion and Stafford found the open RB Maurice Morris to tie the game at 10-10. Later on, the Rams were pinned on their own 2-yard line but got out behind the running of Jackson, allowing them to flip field position and pin the Lions with their punt. The Rams got the ball back and were helped into Lions' territory by a pass interference call. They then used runs of 17 and 25 yards by Jackson to score and take the lead 17-10 with 1:38 remaining. With the ball at their own 20-yard line, The Lions had a play erased by offsetting penalties and were pushed back to the 10-yard line by holding. The next three attempts fell incomplete to end the comeback try.

Kicker Jason Hanson leads all current Lions' players with 1,835 points and is the franchise's all-time leading scorer. In 2009, he became only the 7th player in NFL history to surpass the 1,800 career points mark, and he is currently in 7th place on the NFL's all-time scoring list. Among his career scoring tally are 42 field goals from 50 yards or more. In 2009, he set an NFL record for the most 50-yard field goals in a career and became the first player in league history to go 8-for-8 on 50-yard attempts in a season.
